## **Residential Burglary Suspect Arrested**

Location:	Multiple locations along the I-280 corridor – San Mateo County
Type of Crime:	PC 460(a) – Residential burglary PC 487(a) – Grand theft PC 647(h) – Loiter on private property VC 10852 – Tamper with a motor vehicle
Suspect:	Nathan James Hubbard (29-year-old San Jose resident)

**Woodside, CA -** In March of 2023 Detectives began investigating a series of residential burglaries and trespassing complaints located along the I-280 corridor within San Mateo County. With the help of residential security systems, Automated License Plate Readers (ALPRs) and witness statements, the suspect was identified as Nathan James Hubbard.

On October 12, 2023, with the assistance of San Jose Police Department, Detectives contacted Hubbard within the City of San Jose. Detectives arrested Hubbard for the above listed charges and later booked him into the Maguire Correctional Facility.

Based on this investigation, it is believed Hubbard is possibly associated with other unreported/unidentified burglaries. We ask anyone who may have information about this case to please contact Det.
